Statistical overview

- People in basic care
 - March 2017: ~ 4500 people
 - May, 8th 2018: 2648 people (+ 145 unaccompanied minors)
- People have to fulfil two criteria to be entitled for basic care
 - be in need of help: cannot cover the basic subsitence on his/her own
 - be in need of protection: mainly asylum seekers and refugees till 4 months after receiving their recognition as refugees

Basic care

The basic care includes:

- Accommodation
- Food
- Pocket money
- Health care
- Travel costs in case of transfer (from one accommodation to another) and official interview dates
- Travel costs for pupils and costs covering the school supplies
- Grant for summer and winter clothes
- German language courses in the accommodations
- Repatriation advice
- Tavel costs and start fee in case of volontary return

4 types of accommodation

- A-quarter: full board and lodging, 24 hours care
- C-quarter: self-catering, accommodation units with kitchens; meals allowance
- Private housing: meals and rent allowance
- Quarters for unaccompanied minors
